



### WRKC June News

Lots of exciting things are happening this upcoming weekend June 21<sup>st</sup>. To start with, something every one has been waiting for since Race One. We are going to trial a new method of entering & exiting the track. Effective this week we will be using the North End only. (Where we used to exit). The plan is to divide the exit into two lanes. Karts exiting the track will keep to the right side, single file and proceed to the scales which will be situated right of where it has been to this point. The new Grid area will be on the paved section where the scales used to sit. Karts will be motioned onto the track one row at a time and turn to the right when they are on the actual track surface. When both rows of karts have made there way onto the track, they will take their respective positions side by side and when cleared to do so by the race starter will proceed for their warm up lap. If this system works we plan to expand the paved area for scaling & gridding purposes.

Considering we run 35 heats each day, the new entry/exit method could easily increase the race day by 35 minutes. Effective this weekend we will combine the Senior Heavy & Masters practice sessions only to recoup some of the lost time.
