WRKC + KartStars FAQ

WRKC Race #12 - September 16-18th, 2022



Introduction

WRKC is excited to host round #5 of the KartStars Canada series. This is a fantastic opportunity to continue WRKC's history of hosting successful regional events and showcase the talent of WRKC driver's and the quality of our club and facilities. We encourage our members to be welcoming and friendly to the new faces that will be joining us for this race and share the pride that we have in the WRKC.

Given that many of our members may have not participated in a regional event, we have created a FAQ document to help with some questions. Please note this is not a substitute for the rules and it is the competitor's responsibility to familiarize themselves with all rules and regulations.

Rules & Regulations

All classes will refer strictly to the 2022 KartStars [Technical](#), [Sporting](#), and [Supplemental](#) regulations, with reference to the [2022 Briggs and Stratton Canada 206 Rule Book](#). It is the responsibility of the competitor to read these rules and understand where they may differ from WRKC rules.

Class Structures, Numbers, & Points

All WRKC classes will be run under the designated classes below. It is the responsibility of WRKC members to ensure they are competing in the correct class to obtain WRKC points. Members are welcome to compete in additional classes in which they are eligible for but only the class below will count towards WRKC points. As a reminder, once junior drivers progress to a higher class at any WRKC karting event, they are no longer eligible to compete in any lower classes or licenses. Please reach out to an executive member if you have any questions about class eligibility.

Note: Briggs Cadet class weight is 235 lbs as per KartStars rules.

Points will be awarded based on the final finishing results of the WRKC members per class. The highest finishing WRKC member in each class will receive first place points, the second highest WRKC member will receive second placed points, etc.

Parking

Some WRKC members have an agreement with Flamboro Speedway with regards to reserved parking spaces. These reserved parking spaces will **not** be honoured during the KartStars event. Event move in will occur according to the official event schedule.

Honda Engines

Honda engines will only be permitted in WRKC Cadet, Briggs Cadet, and Briggs Jr. Light classes.

Tram Lines and Race Starts

The tram line and start procedures vary slightly compared to the typical WRKC event. It is the responsibility of each WRKC member to be familiar with the procedures. Please read and understand Section 6.5 Race Starts – Rolling Starts of the 2022 KartStars Sporting Regulations.

Registration, Numbers, & Transponders

Online registration will be live on the KartStars website the week of September 5th. All participants (excluding WRKC Cadet) must register their kart numbers under the [2022 National Number Registry](#). It is free of charge for drivers to register their kart numbers. WRKC will provide transponders for their members to use free of charge as usual.

Grid, Scales, & Kart Stand Parking

The grid area will be separated into its own section, divided by temporary fencing. Each kart will be allowed the driver and one mechanic on the grid. Access to anyone else will be prohibited. Karts must be lowered and enter from the back of the grid. The scale area will be separated into its own section, divided by temporary fencing. No mechanic or spectator will be permitted to handle any kart before it is scaled. All kart stands are to be placed in the designated kart stand area. Kart stands are not to be left at the grid area or any other area than that designated for kart stand parking.
